Recommended Audience: Grades 7-12

Survival Lessons offers a new and modern take on Rudyard Kipling's classic theatrical parable, *The Jungle Book*. The cast, of course, includes Mowgli, Baloo and other familiar and beguiling animal characters.

In the beginning, there is competition, deceit and danger in the jungle. Our hero, Mowgli, eventually becomes the voice of reason and reconciliation, and encourages the cooperation that will allow everyone to survive a serious drought by working together.

“We think the issue of ecology is not only the problem of a single man or a single people – it is a universal problem, because we share the same planet, the ecology of the world depends on the ecology of the soul...” writes the Director, who believes it is vital for children to assimilate this message when they are young.

Theatre studio 'Peremena' was founded in 1991 in a secondary school in Solikams in the Perm region (Ural). The troupe is known for its interpretation of the Russian classics (by Anton Chekhov, Nikolay Gogol, Alexander Ostrovsky, Alexander Pushkin and others) and other children's fairytales and has toured all of the major theatre festivals in Europe and Asia.

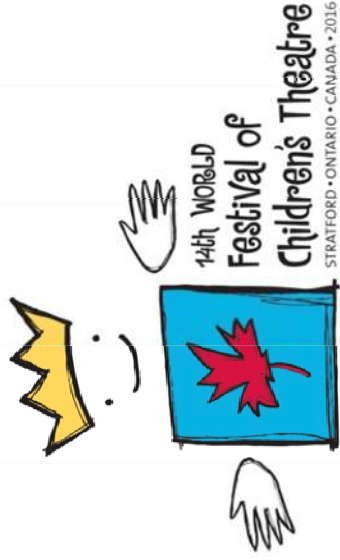
